In 2015-16 SerVermont VISTAs...

- Recruited 1,444 community volunteers who served
 6,126 hours
- Raised \$161,288 in cash resources and \$93,803 in in-kind resources
- Provided 45 organizations with capacity building services
- Trained **301** staff members and community volunteers
- Developed 65 new systems and business processes
- Provided 807 disadvantaged youth with education services
- Provided 348 youth with healthy futures services
- Provided **7, 160** individuals with emergency food

Project Highlights

- At the Farm at VYCC, 2 VISTAs are serving to build capacity for the Health Care Share program. This program engages over 100 disadvantaged youth in educational and employment opportunities on the farm. They learn about sustainable agriculture as they produce fresh vegetables and poultry that is provided free of cost to over 400 lowincome families across four counties. VYCC partners with area healthcare providers to identify food insecure participants that would benefit from the inclusion of more healthy foods in their diet.
- The VISTA at the Two-Rivers Ottauquechee Regional Planning Commission
 has been working to create a video that combats stereotypes on affordable
 housing and will be used to help educate the public about new building projects that will
 provide affordable housing to many low-income Vermonters in the area.
- In Springfield, a VISTA member is serving with Vermont State Parks to develop outdoor education and STEM learning opportunities at a brand new state park. The land was recently donated to the state by Edgar May, the first deputy director of VISTA, with the requirement that it be used to provide local residents, especially low-income youth, with an opportunity to engage with their outdoor environment. The VISTA has been creating partnerships and curriculum to run a pilot summer camp for area youth and is also working to ensure that the site can be designated as a Summer Food Service Program location.
- The VISTA at Rutland Area Farm and Food Link has been building capacity for their Glean Team program. This program engages local volunteers in gleans where they harvest surplus produce from regional farms and donate it to local food shelves and partners serving the low-income community. They have also recently partnered with the Vermont Foodbank which has opened up a new location in Rutland.
- Four VISTAs serving with the Agency of Human Services are each placed in a different quadrant of the state to collect data and form community partnerships to better assist the agency in meeting its goal to end family homelessness by 2020.
